## Dr. Christophe BERNASCONI Secretary General, HCCH

Dr. Christophe BERNASCONI took the office of Secretary General of the HCCH on 1 July 2013. In 2018 and 2023, he was reappointed as Secretary General, with each reappointment being for a period of five years. Dr. Bernasconi had joined the Permanent Bureau (the Secretariat of the HCCH) in September 1997 as Secretary, became First Secretary in May 2000, and Deputy Secretary General in July 2011. He holds a law degree from Fribourg University in Switzerland (magna cum laude; bilingual German and French), an LL.M. degree in comparative law from McGill University in Montreal (Canada), and a doctoral degree in Private International Law from Fribourg University (Dr iur. utr.; summa cum laude). He has been actively involved in numerous normative projects and non-normative activities of the HCCH, covering the full range of its mandate, from transnational litigation and legal cooperation, to international family and child protection law, as well as commercial and finance law. As Secretary General, he is focusing on the good governance and strategic development of the HCCH, spearheading efforts towards its universality and inclusiveness.





Ms. Melissa FORD Secretary, Permanent Bureau of the HCCH

Ms. Melissa FORD joined the Permanent Bureau in October 2022 as Secretary of the Transnational Litigation and Apostille Division. Melissa has primary responsibility at the Permanent Bureau for the 1961 Apostille Convention, 1965 Service Convention, 1970 Evidence Convention, 2005 Choice of Court Convention and the 2019 Judgments Convention. Melissa also has responsibility for the ongoing work of the Jurisdiction Project.

Prior to joining the Permanent Bureau, Melissa was a Principal Legal Officer in the Australian Government where she was Chief of Staff to the Secretary of the Attorney-General's Department. Before taking up that role, Melissa was the Director of the Private International & Commercial Law Section of the Attorney-General's Department. This Section is the National Organ to the HCCH, the Central Authority for the 1965 Service and 1970 Evidence Conventions, and responsible for work relating to the 2005 Choice of Court and 2019 Judgments Conventions. Melissa was a delegate at various HCCH meetings, including the Council on General Affairs and Policy, Special Commissions, and the 2019 Diplomatic Session. Melissa has also worked across a range of policy and legal areas, including Commonwealth criminal law reform and policy, personal property securities, personal insolvency legislative reform and policy, international legal assistance, mutual assistance in criminal matters and international extradition.

Professor Xu studied law in China, Switzerland, the Netherlands and Germany, concluding his doctoral studies at the University of Hamburg; he was awarded the title Dr. Juris in 1994.

Professor Xu is an expert in the settlement of international commercial disputes. As counsel and arbitrator, he has participated in the settlement of hundreds of commercial dispute cases. He participated in the 20th Diplomatic Session of the Hague Conference of Private International Law as a member of the Chinese delegation to negotiate and adopt the 2005 Hague Convention on the Agreement on Choice of Courts. Furthermore, he was a delegate of China in four Special Commission meetings in 2016, 2017 and 2018 and the 22nd Diplomatic Session of the Hague Conference of Private International Law in 2019, to draft and adopt the 2019 Hague Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Civil and Commercial Judgments.

Professor Xu is a vice-president of the China Society of Private International Law, a member of the Administrative Review Committee of the Shanghai Municipal People's Government and Distinguished Dean of the School of International Law of Shanghai University of Political Science and Law. He is also an arbitrator of the China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission ("CIETAC"), the Shanghai International Arbitration Center ("SHIAC") and the arbitration commissions of cities including Shanghai, Hangzhou and Shenyang. Professor Xu is fluent in Mandarin Chinese, German and English.





Dr. Jacek KOZIKOWSKI

Jacek Kozikowski, PhD is a managing partner at a law firm Kozikowski & Partners sp.k. specializing in legal services for construction projects in the fields of industrial, infrastructure, and energy. She obtained her Doctoral degree from the Faculty of Law, Sydney University and LL.M. degree from the American University, in Washington DC.

She is involved in preparing the Draft Bill of Indonesian Private International Law and works together with the Indonesian Ministry of Foreign Affairs to develop the Indonesian international civil procedure.

Her research focuses on the development of Indonesian Private International Law. Her most recent publications in 2021 are a book titled 'Indonesian Private International Law' and a book chapter in 'Direct Jurisdiction', under the series of 'Studies in Private International Law in Asia'.

Professor Yun ZHAO is Representative of Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific of the Hague Conference on Private International Law. He also serves as Henry Cheng Professor in International Law and Associate Dean (Mainland Affairs), Faculty of Law at The University of Hong Kong (HKU). He obtained his PhD degree from Erasmus University Rotterdam, LLM degree from Leiden University, and LLM & LLB degrees from China University of Political Science and Law. Professor ZHAO is currently a Standing Council Member of the Chinese Society of International Law, Council Member of Zhuhai International Court of Arbitration, and Chair Professor at Xiamen University. Professor ZHAO is listed as arbitrator in several international arbitration commissions. He is also a founding Council Member of the Hong Kong Internet Forum, Director of the International Institute of Space Law, a member of the Asia Pacific Law Association and the Beijing International Law Society. He has published widely on various topics including particularly Space Law and Dispute Resolution.
