# Questionnaire on the impact of COVID-19 on intercountry adoptions under the 1993 Adoption Convention

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## I. OVERARCHING QUESTIONS

### Both States of origin and receiving States

1. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, has your State **modified** intercountry adoption procedures under the 1993 Adoption Convention? If so, what has your State done to ensure that the **safeguards and procedures** of the Convention have been, and continue to be, respected?

The emergency provisions adopted by the Italian Government established:

- from March,9, 2020: the automatic rescheduling of all judicial hearings (except for urgent matters, such as in the civil sector- cases regarding eligibility of prospective adoptive parents (PAPs) in the intercountry adoption proceedings);
- from May, 11, 2020: Court (including Juvenile Court) Presidents, after consulting the Health Authorities and the representatives of the legal professions, could adopt measures and guidelines with regard to the scheduling and the carrying out of the judicial proceedings. For the judicial proceeding hearings that have been maintained in the JC, special measure of protection has been implemented, i.e.:
- Temperature control at the entrance;
- Mandatory mask-wearing requirements for everyone: judges, prosecutors, administrative staff (equipment have been furnished by the Ministry of Justice) and users;
- respect for distances even in JC rooms;
- in the small JC rooms, identification of the maximum number of people present and installation of Plexiglas screens.

For health reasons, Article 83 of Legislative Decree 18 of 2020 provided the possibility of carrying out judicial proceedings hearings by video-conference (Microsoft Teams platform virtual room).

Despite objective, instrumental and above all adequate orientation difficulties, the Juvenile Courts continues to celebrate in civil matters the proceedings dealing with the most serious and urgent situations concerning the protection of children, i.e. child adoptability.

In front of these situations, as in many other areas, we also found ourselves managing and confronting a rapid and not always functional digital literacy path.

	During 2020, a hundred of children benefited from these initiatives.
