The national centers and the care, investigation and training modules have an interdisciplinary group of professionals in the psychological, medical and legal areas that have meetings regularly to exhaust tall the possibilities so the girls, boys and teenagers could been adopted in their origin country.

The interdisciplinary technical group establishes, based on their bio-psycho-social development, if the girl, boy or teenager is able to be assigned in adoption, joined to that they must have their legal situation already regularized.

The consent by the mother, the National Center Director, the training and attention module or the one that the law authorize to give the consent, must be written and must be ratified to the court in charge of the adoption.

The psychological, medical social work, pedagogical and legal areas provide all the time the consultancy for the adoptive parents.

The applicants file of intercountry adoption is reviewed firstly by the legal area, to verify the documents authenticity and that they fulfill the stipulated points.

Secondly, it is sent to the Centro Nacional Modelo de Atención Investigación y Capacitación (Model National Center of Attention, Investigation and Training), for its psychological and social revaluation to pronounce un predictamen de procedencia e improcedencia of the adoption application form para culminar en el Consejo Técnico de Adopciones, órgano colegiado que confirma o modifica el predictamen.

The post adoptive work following is coordinated with the Central Authorities or with the Consular Authorities.
