Working Group on Parentage / Surrogacy: Report of the fourth meeting (from 7 to 11 April 2025)

I. Introduction

- 1 From 7 to 11 April 2025, the Working Group (WG) on Parentage / Surrogacy met for the fourth time. The meeting was held in person at the offices of the Permanent Bureau (PB) of the HCCH in The Hague, with the possibility for online participation. The meeting was attended by 41 delegates and other experts, representing 25 HCCH Members and three Observers, as well as by members of the PB. The list of participants is included as Annex II.
- 2 At its 2023 meeting, the Council on General Affairs and Policy (CGAP) mandated the establishment of a WG on private international law (PIL) matters related to legal parentage generally, including legal parentage resulting from an international surrogacy arrangement. In addition, CGAP mandated:
 - "5. a. the Working Group first to explore provisions for, if possible, one new instrument on these matters, to further inform CGAP on policy considerations in relation to the scope and content of such instrument, including on the feasibility of reaching consensus. The Working Group could later explore the possibility of two instruments, if necessary;
 - b. the Working Group to proceed on the basis that the aim of any new instrument would be to provide greater predictability, certainty and continuity of legal parentage in international situations for all persons concerned, taking into account their human rights, including, for children, those enshrined in the *United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child* (UNCRC) and in particular their right that their best interests be a primary consideration in all actions taken concerning them;
 - c. the Working Group to draw on the ideas and assessments in the Final Report of the Experts' Group, recognising that a number of elements and approaches identified could feature either on their own or in a combined way; [...].^{"1}
- For the purpose of the WG "[t]o further develop provisions for a draft instrument and draft a final report of the work of the WG, CGAP invited the PB, in addition to the April 2025 meeting, to convene one further in-person meeting, with the possibility for online participation, within Financial Year (FY) 2025-2026, possibly in the second half of 2025, with intersessional work as required, as well as, if necessary, one online meeting before CGAP 2026. Intersessional work should take place online."²
- 4 CGAP also "reiterated that any work by the HCCH in relation to private international law (PIL) matters related to legal parentage resulting from surrogacy arrangements should not be understood as supporting or opposing surrogacy".³
- 5 The *Aide-mémoire* of the Chair of the WG set out in Annex I provides an overview of the main points of discussion at the Group's fourth meeting.

II. Proposal for CGAP

6 The WG invites CGAP to take note of the *Aide-mémoire* contained in Annex I of this document prepared by the Chair of the WG, based on the deliberations during the fourth meeting.

ANNEXES

Annex I

Aide-mémoire of the fourth meeting of the Working Group on Parentage / Surrogacy prepared by the Chair

- 1 This *Aide-mémoire* provides an overview of the main points of discussion at the fourth meeting of the Working Group (WG) held from 7 to 11 April 2025, under the chairmanship of Professor Michael Hellner (Sweden).
- 2 The WG pursued its discussion on safeguards / standards and how they could be included in an instrument. In this context, the WG recalled its mandate to proceed on the basis that the aim of any new instrument would be to provide greater predictability, certainty and continuity of legal parentage in international situations for all persons concerned, taking into account their human rights, including, for children, those enshrined in the *United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child* (UNCRC) and in particular their right that their best interests be a primary consideration in all actions taken concerning them.

A. Draft report and provisions for a possible Convention

- 3 Prior to the fourth meeting a subgroup had carried out intersessional work on the draft Report and draft provisions for a possible instrument on legal parentage, including indirect grounds of jurisdiction, grounds for refusal and other matters concerning the recognition of judgments on legal parentage. The *rapporteur* of the subgroup presented an overview of work done to date.
- 4 The WG continued to work on the subgroup's draft provisions for a possible instrument on legal parentage and started its review of the draft Report to CGAP.

B. Future work

- 5 The Group will meet for its fifth meeting in November 2025 in order, among other things, to finalise its Final Report to CGAP. In preparation for its next meeting, the Group agreed that, based on the discussions at the fourth meeting, a subgroup would carry out intersessional work before November 2025. This subgroup will work on the Final Report, which includes draft provisions for a possible future instrument, discussions of policy issues arising, and sets out conclusions regarding the feasibility of reaching consensus on these issues and an instrument itself.
- 6 The Chair invited members of the WG to submit suggestions and / or comments intersessionally on the draft provisions by returning the draft text in track changes and / or with the addition of comments or by submitting these suggestions / comments in the form of (a) Working Document(s).
