




(electricians, medical doctors, teachers, watchmakers, craftsmen, engineers, computer scientists, car manufacturers,...)

No (proper) evaluation of our work!

Consequences...



Possibilities are limited:

- Right/wrong decision? Which criteria to apply?
- Limited opportunity to <u>learn from decisions</u>
- No science possible (statistics, theories, theses, etc.)
- Decisions (still) made on an <u>unclear basis</u>
- <u>Social</u> impact of the decisions <u>unknown</u>


Hypothesis 2







ICPC: Involvement of Children in Parental Conflict

What explains the results?

<u>Increasing exposure</u> of children to parental conflict situations (C>B>A)? and/or

Parental conflict situations that are <u>increasingly serious</u> (C>B>A)? and/or

<u>Increasing involvement of the children in the parental conflict (C>B>A)?</u>
and/or

An increasing threat to parental bonding (C>B>A)? and/or

An increasing bad-mouthing of the other parent (C>B>A)? and/or

An increasing guilty conscience of child concerning the absent parent (own or inducted) (C>B>A)?





What explains the results?

Additionally (International Child Abduction)

Intercultural-interpersonal Aspects

New: Culture, Language, Environment, Contact Persons
Or else: isolation?



More vulnerability – more helplessness – hopelessness

More Fear... insecurity...

Deeper imbalance





Whole picture

+ Parents are – at least (!!) – as much affected as the children (!!)

Hence they are relevant for their well-being (!!)

Thus: Social relevance:

per highly contentious family
Are about 3-8 people affected

+ Transgenerational effect

X - but imagine the total costs for society

FSS - Mandate-Outcome discrepancy



Hypotheses

- 1) (Legal) tradition
- 2) Inconsistent application of the legal system (custody Law v rest of legal system)
- 3) The core of the parental conflict is emotional
- 4) Translation of the parental conflict into legal categories
- 5) Limited resources


Relocation after child Abduction

Elements to consider from the Child's perspective

- 1. <u>Law</u>: condition sine que non for a solution, but ≠ solution (Only parent, then the other, then the first one again?)
 Legal situation? Maybe jail?
 - 2. Relocation but (emotional) Parental conflict situation <u>still unresolved</u>
 - 3. Children need...
 - Affection, Guidance, Bonds... and conflict protection
 - 4. FSS: unintended <u>own contribution</u> to the conflict? (secondary child jeopardizing)
- 5. Methods: Parents = resource (real experts) => Mediation
